## **GUIDELINES FOR VISITING RESEARCHERS**

# A/ Definition

A visiting researcher is an associate professor or researcher (senior or postdoctoral) who is received for a definite term within the UMR 8150. Colleagues wishing to be hosted as visiting researchers may apply in the fields of art history and theory as well as in the disciplinary branches represented in the Centre André Chastel. A researcher must have strong interactions with members of the unit and his/her research work must be in line with the Centre's themes.

### B/ Duration

The duration of the invitation is agreed between the management and the researcher (from 4 up to 6 weeks).

# C/ Implications

Researchers commit to participate in the life of the laboratory by contributing to scientific activities (colloquia, lectures, seminars, etc.), in agreement with the receiving member(s) of the Centre André-Chastel.

Visiting researchers cannot be project leads.

During their stay at the Centre André-Chastel, guest researchers are asked to mention their affiliation with the Centre André-Chastel when taking part in colloquia, seminars or in their publications.

At the end of their stay, visiting researchers must submit a report to the Centre's management outlining their activities and the results of their research during their stay in the laboratory.

#### D/ Commitment of the Centre André-Chastel

For the duration of their stay, visiting researchers will be provided with a fully-equipped office on the Centre's premises and, if their stay is not funded by their home institution, assistance of up to €1,000 (for accommodation and/or travel expenses).









# E/ Procedure

Applications must be submitted by a full member and sent to the management. The dossier should include the candidate's CV and a research project (in English or French, maximum 1000 words). Applications will then be examined by the Unit Council.
